Cllr Dr Byrd welcomed everyone to the meeting and invited the members of the public to address the Committee.

The members of public wanted to raise their concerns regarding Peterborough's Local Plan and the possibility of a new mini township and the impact and strain this would have on the local infrastructure such as doctors, roads, transport and schools. Has Peterborough City Council, if this site was to go ahead, considered what arrangements would be put in place to support the Deepings infrastructure.
