Cllr Miss Moran asked if 'The Little Barber Shop' was in the conservation area since she had been informed that it had an illuminated barber pole. The Clerk agreed to check and if it was against the planning permission she would report it to SKDC.

86. For members to receive an update on active travel provisions at Wellington Way

The Deputy Clerk had received a reply from Philip Moore to her request. He had agreed to assess the detailed plans for S16/0112 once they had been submitted in regards to a footbridge across Carr Dyke. He advised that the Council liaise with LCC if there is enough evidence to designate the north part of Wellington Way into a public right of way. Likewise evidence would be required to designate Blenheim Way as a public right of way. Cllr Brookes agreed to look into the best way to suggest that these areas are made into public rights of way and would report back to the committee.

87. For members to receive an update on the renewal of the contract with Glendale Groundworks This item was discussed under agenda item 78

88. For members to consider any alterations to the mini roundabout on Godsey Lane at the junction with the **New River Retail site**

Cllr Brookes informed the members that he had looked at the site and believed that a compact roundabout would be best for that junction. The Clerk was asked to suggest this to New River Retail.

89. Update on the possibility of Christmas lighting in the Riverside Beads and Crafts area and to adjust the budget accordingly

Cllr Miss Moran had visited the antique centre and obtained an email address for the owner. The Clerk would write to ascertain their willingness to have Christmas lights. The budget had been increased in agenda item 80c) to make allowance for them

Cllr Brookes informed the members that no decision had been made from the enquiry but when it is, he did not expect it to be clear cut. He was hoping it would be announced in a couple of weeks

91. To update members on the information from the interactive Speed Sign (Cllr Brookes)
