8. a)Update on how this council can have a say on the spending of S106 money

After a discussion it was agreed that members should think about how they would like S106 money spent locally and to bring these suggestions to the next meeting

b)Update on whether council houses are to be built in the Deepings

A letter had been received from Neil Cucksey stating that at present there were no plans for council housing in the Deeping s but that SKDC were aware of the local needs. Cllr Shelton informed the committee that the Neighbourhood Plan committee would soon be delivering a questionnaire to all households which would enquire about their social needs

9. To update members on the progress of the allotments on the Persimmon Home development A letter had been received from Persimmon Homes stating that hopefully the allotments would be ready for handover in Spring 2017

10. Enquiry from Annual Town Meeting: Update on residents enquiries re Northfields Road development

Cllr Mrs Redshaw gave the councillors a brief history of the Towngate area stating its historical importance. She reminded the members of the comments made at the Annual Town meeting by residents regarding the proposed development in this area. After a discussion it was agreed that the deputy clerk would write to SKDC asking if they had taken these residents comments into account in their discussions on this development. The deputy clerk was also asked to sent a copy of the residents letter to members.

- **11.** a) To update members on the letter to be delivered to all households in the conservation area All members were handed the letters to deliver in the conservation area
 - b) Update on the meeting with Ian Wright Principle Conservation Officer for SKDC Cllr Mrs Redshaw went through her notes from the meeting with Ian Wright that had been distributed to members. He had agreed to investigate some queries and members would wait for his reply. She informed members that 116-122 was up for sale with a Spalding estate agents. Cllr Lester informed members that his employer had recently asked him to arrange a quote for work at the building. It was agreed that the deputy clerk would inform Ian Wright about the sale listing. It was also agreed that councillors should bring suggestions of buildings in the conservation area that could be reported to Historic England to be listed.

12. Update from Cllr Shelton regarding the Neighbourhood Plan process.

Cllr Shelton informed members that he would be providing a written report for full council meeting and that he would be giving a verbal report at the Deeping St James Parish Council Annual Parish Meeting

13. To update members on the Interactive Speed Sign

Cllr Brookes informed members that he had downloaded the information but as yet had not had time to assess it. The deputy clerk would give him the dates and locations of the sign. He had located two lamp posts on Towngate East where the speed sign may be located but there was no suitable lamp post on Northfields Road. It was agreed to look back at the previous survey to see which other sites LCC had suggested would be suitable.

14. To update members on correspondence regarding the corner of Blenheim Way and to decide the next steps

Cllr Mrs Redshaw informed the members that herself and Cllr Brookes are meeting with Kevin Brumfield on 17th May at 9am and they would discuss this matter with him. She invited other members to attend if they wished.

- 15. To discuss the Lincolnshire Permit Scheme and decide on response to the consultation It was agreed that the deputy clerk should reply stating that they were pleased to see anything that took control of highways when works were planned.
- 16. Update on the pedestrian crossing on Godsey Lane (near to the primary school / John Eve Field) regarding children's safety when using the crossing.

Amendments were planned for the summer months but Cllr Mrs Redshaw would enquire further at the meeting with Kevin Brumfield

17. Footpath 4: Update on the condition and progress being made by SKDC regarding the town councils comments

A reply had been received from Andrea Philpotts at LCC stating that she had met with Persimmon Homes and amendments to the footpath had been discussed. After a discussion it was agreed that the clerk would write to Andrea Philpotts stating that the council were not happy with the condition, maintenance and prospects of this footpath. It had been diverted without permission and that the council would like a site visit with Ms Philpotts, enforcement officer and Persimmon Homes.

- 18. Request from the Rotary Club of the Deepings for the signs at the entrance of the town to include a mention of the Rotary Club and for members to decide the next steps. It was agreed that the deputy clerk would reply stating that the council could not make a decision on this matter since the sign belonged to LCC Highways and they would have to enquire with them
- 19. Update on the Scout Hut in Wellington Way to be preserved as a community interest building
 A letter had been received stating that the nomination had been accepted and the building
 would be placed on The Register of Assets of Community Value
