# 129. For members to consider Quiet Lanes status for Millfield Road – Cllr Mrs Jones

Cllr Mrs Jones outlined that quiet lane status would need to be instigated by Highways at LCC and would involve a consultation with the public. Millfield Road is currently 60mph and this would reduce with quiet lane status. Cllr Mrs Jones would enquire to see if there is any up-to-date information available. It was agreed to discuss this further with the Highways officer.

At the Planning and Highways Committee meeting on the 1<sup>st</sup> December 2021 it was agreed to allocate £250 to install a small fence and replenish the gravel. Before any maintenance work takes place to the existing site Cllr Mrs Redshaw requests that a different location is identified. It was agreed to raise this with the Highways team at Lincolnshire County Council.
